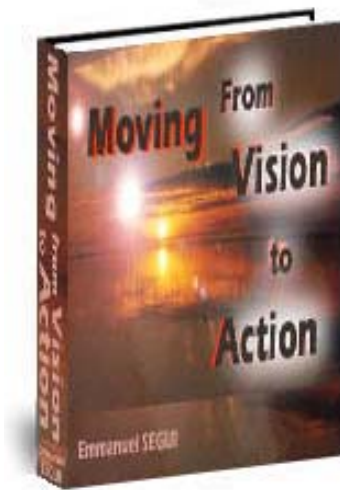

Introduction

Maybe, you have read one of these books that mention the steps to follow in order to lose 28 pounds in only 16 days or 10 pounds in 10 days. One of your friends comes to see you: "I followed the recipe with exactness, and it works!" Now, you are so enthusiastic and you are ready to begin. Some days later, you've read another testimony of the woman who tried the diet and didn't lose a pound, or lost some weight but gained back double and your hopes disappear. "I won't be able to do it" is the logical conclusion you get from the story. What makes the difference? Why do some succeed and others don't? What's the difference that makes the difference?

Some inspiring men have studied that difference and have tried to explain why. They focused on 'how' people do what they do and they began to study the structure of human experience. They worked with the best therapists of their time in order to find the little differences that make them good therapists. They finally succeeded and set a kind of 'model of excellence'.

John Grinder and Richard Bandler, founders of this discipline at the beginning of the 70s, studied the fact that the way we **think, speak** and **act** will have a tremendous impact in our lives. Because the mind is so interconnected with the body, they influence each other, and express themselves through language. That's what NLP is. NLP stands for Neuro-linguistic programming. We here find our three components that will influence our lives: to success or mediocrity.

NLP could be defined as the science of achievement. It offers tools, or more precisely, models of change and success. These models have been developed through the study of ordinary men who achieved extraordinary things. Among them, were Milton Erickson, Virginia Satir, Fritz Perls, who were exceptional therapists. From that time, models have been born: models of communication, leadership, therapy, change...

As you already know, the purpose of this book is to offer guidelines or secrets to realize your dreams, to awaken you to your inner strength and to tend to wholeness. NLP offers many tools and we are going to study one of them that will be our framework. This is the model of the 'logical levels', developed by Robert Dilts, one of the main developers in that field. He is also an author, a speaker and a consultant who travels around the world, trying to find new wisdom, new models of leadership, communication and change.

There are six levels that we will understand and use to reach our vision and realize our full potential. The function of each level is to organize and structure the information of the level below. Each level will be a chapter.

The highest level is the level of Vision or 'Spiritual'.

"To what do we belong? To whom we belong?" What is the purpose of our life?" This is the level where we are going to define our **vision**. This chapter will awaken you to the necessity of having a vision to move forward on the road of success

The second level below is the level of identity.

"What is our mission or our role, which would be the best way to reach our vision? This chapter will remind you of how exceptional you are. As every human being, you are special and your contribution is important. You're then going to define your role for your vision.

The third level is the level of beliefs and values that we have for ourselves, others and the world we live in. "Why do we do what we do" would be the question related to this level. Do my beliefs and values agree with my mission/vision? This chapter will explain what a belief is and will help you to strengthen your beliefs to succeed or to transform your limiting beliefs.

The fourth level is the level of capabilities or strategies that you will develop in order to fulfil your mission and what you really want in your life. The question related to this level is "how do you do it", in terms of mental strategies, to reach my vision?" This chapter will enhance your abilities to master your emotional life.

The fifth level is the level of *behaviour*, of action.

"What do I have to do to reach my goals, my vision? This chapter explains how to act in order to succeed. I'm going to share with you the NLP goal setting model and the principle of persistence; a must have quality for everyone who wants to become a true leader.

The last level is the level of *environment*. "Where and when does the experience take place? What are the constraints and the opportunities linked with this experience? "

These different levels help us to understand how to structure our experiences on the pathway of life. I would say that a vision doesn't become concrete by only setting goals. Of course, I will speak about goals but that is not the only thing I will speak about. I'm not writing a book on goals. I'm writing a book on wholeness in order to reach a vision. Your whole being, all your beliefs and values, all your mental attitudes and all your actions should be in harmony and vibrate so that you can realize your full potential, be totally consistent and aligned with your experience and have an infallible faith. We are Spiritual Creatures who live an exceptional adventure. Somebody said that it seems like our whole body was made for one only purpose: "*to realize our full potential as human beings*"

As Abraham Maslow suggested in his pyramid of human needs, self-actualization, or self-fulfilment is a fundamental need of every human being. Because we are so special as human beings, we can have a special life. Ponder on what you can do with your hands. You can inspire or make people cry by playing wonderful music on a piano. You can relieve people in pain with a good massage. You can caress the body of your loved one. You can heal people. You can create things. The list is endless. Now ponder on what you can do with your feet. You can run to save someone from danger. You can cross countries and share something important for others like the Christians who go all over the world to share the gospel. You can also walk. The list is endless. Think about what you can do with your mind. Everything! As William Shakespeare said in his work, Hamlet:

“What a piece of work is man! How noble in reason! How infinite in faculty! In form and movement how express and admirable! In action how like an angel! In apprehension how like a god! The beauty of the world!
The paragon of animals!”
(Hamlet, act 2, scene 2, lines 303-7).

We have a divine nature within us with such a tremendous potential. The difference between mediocrity and excellence can be very small. Just look at Olympic games and you will realize that difference is often measured in tenths of seconds. Fortunately, not just one in this life can receive a gold medal of success, but the possibility is there for everyone. In the process of understanding what excellence is, learning from others and persisting in what you want, you will eventually receive the gold medal of excellence.

I will share with you the words of Gordon B. Hinckley, a man of God: “My wife likes to tell the story of a friend of hers who, when she was a little girl, was left an orphan. She scarcely knew her mother. As she grew, she wondered about her mother: what kind of a girl, what kind of a woman was she? One day she came across her mother’s old report card. The teacher had noted on that card: “**This student is excellent in every way.**” When she read that, her entire life changed. She recognized that her mother was a woman of excellence. Her whole attitude changed. She took on the aura of excellence herself and became a remarkable woman in her own right. She married a man who was recognized in many communities, and their children distinguished themselves for their excellence.

I speak of the need for a little more effort, a little more self-discipline, a little more consecrated effort in the direction of excellence in our lives.

Today is the great day of decision for each of us. For many today is the time of beginning something that will go on for as long as they live. I plead with you: don't be a scrub! Rise to the high ground of spiritual, mental, and physical excellence. You can do it. You may not be a genius. You may be lacking in some skills. But all of us can do better than we are now doing. We are people with a present and with a future. Don't muffle your opportunities. Be excellent"

I know that we can do better, in each part of our life. It is possible to stretch and to stand a little taller. You have only one life, make it the best you can.

Create a vision

“All of these achievers were possessed by the dream of doing their best, of reaching the outermost limits of their ability -- and transcending them.

A need to grow

Abraham Harold Maslow was born in New York City on 1 April 1908, the son of Samuel Maslow, a barrel repairman, and his wife Rose, both immigrants from Russia. He died in Menlo Park, California on 8 June 1970. Abraham studied psychology at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, earning a BA in 1930, an MA in 1931 and a Ph.D. in 1934.

Maslow was a founding figure of what became known as the humanistic school of psychology, which sought explanations for human motivation in an inner core of instinct, and feeling that all humans possess. This basic core is common to all people, but manifests itself in each individual in different ways and at different times. Maslow himself begins by stating the influences that helped him develop this theory, mentioning the pragmatic philosophy of William James and John Dewey, the Gestalt theories of Wertheimer and Goldstein, and other psychologists including Freud, Reich and Adler. Finally, in 1954, he describes motivation as stemming from what he calls a ‘hierarchy of needs’, which consists of five sets of basic needs:

physiological needs
safety needs
belongingness and love needs
esteem needs
self-actualization needs.

He felt that people are basically trustworthy, self-protecting, and self-governing. Humans tend toward growth and love. They follow a dream, move toward wholeness and realize their potential. Development or growth is eventually our most important goal. According to Maslow, a man who is 'self-actualized' or 'self-fulfilled' is a wise man; totally free to live the life he wants to live. He also studied exemplary people such as Albert Einstein, Jane Adams, Eleanor Roosevelt, and Mahatma Gandhi. He studied their lives, their achievements, their values; he set models of peak performance people. The values he suggested one must have to reach wholeness are identified in the chapter III

Self-actualization is "the desire to become more and more what one is, to become everything that one is capable of becoming."

People on this level work at something very precious and call it a vocation or calling. These people are healthy, strong, smart and creative. Maslow included saintly people on this level.

Maslow believed that once a person is self actualized, he is in a position to follow his calling, his dreams.

*"A musician must make music, an artist must paint, a poet must write,
if they are to be ultimately at peace with themselves.*

What a man can be, he must be.

This need we call self-actualization."

If self-actualization is a need, men have to, sooner or later, follow those dreams. Unfortunately, lots of people just dream, thinking, "It's only a dream". My mom said to me one day: "That's why we call it dreams. We can't realize them". I don't agree. She then argued and I realized something as she spoke. Of course she had dreams, but she had also fears. She had the fear of losing what she called safety! Now, I could understand, through this conversation, that most of the people *fear* to succeed, or *fear* to work on realizing their dreams because they will lose what they call 'their safety'. Of course, they will lose something, but they are going to gain something better.

Every goal requires a sacrifice; you can't escape from that. Instead of thinking "I will lose safety" think "I will gain so much more money, or creativity, or stability in the future. I will have so much more safety."

For some people, it's hard to think *long-term*, that's the problem with addiction for example. People look for short-term pleasure without thinking of the long-term results, which almost always turn into suffering. Unfaithfulness to your wife or husband is short-term thinking. By thinking long term, they would know what pain they would cause to themselves and to all the family. Always think long term. Follow your dream and become whole. This may require a sacrifice of time, money or talents but **thinking short term, having a dream not realized and staying where you are demands also sacrifice and pain: you will never know what you are capable of becoming.**

We have a need to grow. We have to fulfil it. Think long term and visualize your dream already realized. What a wonderful feeling!

Success begins with an idea. Inventors are called such because one day they had an idea. A safety pin, a telephone or a light bulb have one thing in common: these inventions began with an idea, which was transformed into a vision and eventually transmuted into its physical equivalent.

Every creation is born in imagination. Then, through faith and work, it is transmuted into its physical equivalent. Every outstanding enterprise, and every great invention began in the imagination of some one person.

Thomas A. Edison created the talking machine and the moving picture machine and the incandescent electric light bulb and other useful inventions, in his own "imagination," before they became a reality.

Dr Lazanov's method of accelerated learning was first born out of an idea. In the same way, NLP was born from the question: *What is it that people do that makes them successful?*

Bette Nesmith became a millionaire thanks to one single idea. By using her imagination, she invented her product "Mistake Out" and made a fortune. Let me share with you her story, found in Crossroads, Issue No. 7, pp. 3-4:

Bette Nesmith had a good secretarial job in a Dallas bank when she ran across a problem that interested her. Wasn't there a better way to correct the errors she made on her electric typewriter? Bette had some art experience and she knew that artists who worked in oils just painted over their errors. Maybe that would work for her too. So she concocted a fluid to paint over her typing errors. Before long, all the secretaries in her building were using what she then called "Mistake Out". She attempted to sell the product idea to marketing agencies and various companies (including IBM), but they turned her down. However, secretaries continued to like her product, so Bette Nesmith's kitchen became her first manufacturing facility and she started selling it on her own. When Bette Nesmith sold the enterprise, the tiny white bottles were earning \$3.5 million annually on sales of \$38 million. The buyer was Gillette Company and the sale price was \$47.5 million.

As a musician, I love the story of that pianist who teaches us how success comes first in the mind:

Liu Chi Kung, who placed second to Van Cliburn in the 1948 Tchaikovsky competition, was imprisoned a year later during the Cultural Revolution in China. During the entire seven years he was held, he was denied the use of a piano. Soon after his release, however, he was back on tour. Critics wrote in astonishment that his musicianship was better than ever.

"How did you do this?" a critic asked. "You had no chance to practice for seven years."

"I did practice," Liu replied, "every day. I rehearsed every piece I have ever played, note by note, in my mind."

Everything is created twice : first in your imagination. Then, with faith and work, it becomes a reality.

More than an objective, a vision is like your personal legend, your Saint Grail that moves you forward, ever forward. Use your imagination and believe! Success is right where you are. The resources you need to turn your dreams into a reality are within you because you are a successful creation of an infinite power.
